1. Entries open only to exhibitors between the ages of 8-19 who comply with Rule 40. Swine entry fee is \$10.

DEADLINE OF REGISTRATION SEE RULE 1 IN GENERAL RULES: ENTRY FEE WILL BE REQUIRED FOR EACH ANIMAL ON THE ENTRY FORM. JOINT OWNERS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED. ONE EXHIBITOR PER FORM. NO DUPLICATE ENTRIES.

SWINE WILL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE THE PSEUDORABIES TAG.

NO REFUND WILL BE MADE AFTER ENTRIES CLOSE. A \$25.00 charge will be assessed for checks returned from the bank for any reason.

EXHIBITOR ENTRY STATEMENT

See Exhibitors General Rules and Regulations.

2. No Market Swine will be allowed to enter the fairgrounds before 8:00 A.M. Friday, September 22. All Market Swine must be in place in pens assigned by superintendent by 8:00 P.M. Friday, September 22 and remain on exhibition until 2:00 P.M. Sunday, September 24, except sale order animals.

Junior Swine

JUDGING WILL BEGIN SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 24 AT 9:00 A.M. IN SHOW BARN - B

All Junior animals and equipment must be out of the barn by 9:00 P.M. Sunday, September 24. All Swine must enter Gate 6 on Plum Street during official check in hours only.

- 4. Each exhibitor shall be responsible for keeping pens and alleys in a clean condition. All pens and alleys shall be thoroughly cleaned each morning.
- 5. NO PAINT OR PAINT PRODUCTS. VIOLATION WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION.
- 6. All market swine must weigh between 220 and 290 pounds to show.
- 7. Swine will be shown by breed (as listed above) and weight. Classes will be determined after all entries are in. If there are not 10 animals representing the above breeds, they will show in other purebreed class.
- 8. THERE WILL BE AN OFFICIAL WEIGH-IN. Exhibitors will bring animals to superintendent to weight in time between 5 P.M. 8 P.M. Friday, September 22. Show classes for each breed will then be determined. Classes will be kept as uniform in size as possible and will be posted.
- 9. Each exhibitor may bring only two swine in the show, but may enter as many as they wish.
- 10. All swine must be owned by exhibitor sixty days prior to show.

11. Administration of a drug – See General Rules, Page 11, Paragraph 9.

- 12. An exhibitor may show a barrow or a gilt.
- 13. Any hog shown in the wrong class will be disqualified.
- 14. Pens will be assigned upon arrival by swine superintendent.
- 15. Two cards turned in on the same animal will result in disqualification.
- 16. Exhibitors may not reserve or "hold" pens for later arriving exhibitors or pigs. Exhibitors wishing to pen together must arrive together. However, due to limited space, pigs will be penned at the discretion of the swine/barn superintendent.
- 17. Exhibitors are allowed to bring tack in early. However, pen assignments will not be made until pigs arrive on the fairgrounds. Tack will be placed in a designated area until the pigs arrive. No tack allowed in pens.
- 18. Due to limited pen space, 2-3 pigs will be assigned to each pen. Individuals should bring panels to separate their pigs. 4' x 8' pens
- 19. The swine superintendent will distribute entry cards after the pigs have been placed in an assigned pen. EXHIBITORS WILL NOT RECEIVE AN ENTRY CARD UNTIL THEIR PIG IS IN THEIR ASSIGNED PEN.
- 20. Exhibitors who have not returned a completed entry card by 8:00 p.m., Fri., Sept. 22nd, will be required to remove their animal from the fairgrounds.
- 21. Any exhibitor, chapter or club dismantling or changing the shape of a 4' x 8' pen will cause the disqualification of the entire group. **No one besides exhibitors are allowed in holding pen or placement.**

According to Arkansas State Regulations, all swinne exhibited at the AR/OK State Fair will have to have an official 840 tag issued by a state agency.
