

# Floriculture

## Floriculture

1. Exhibits must be grown by exhibitor.
2. Exhibits may be checked in from 2:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M., Wednesday, September 28.
3. Only one exhibit may be made per class, except as noted below.
4. Any exhibit that does not fit into a class may be entered under the appropriate miscellaneous class (D-20 or E-10) at the discretion of the Superintendent. More than one exhibit may be shown in this class if the exhibit is not a duplicate of another class.
5. Vases will be provided by fair officials.
6. Open to adults and juniors.
7. Superintendent has the authority to determine which class item is to be entered in and to reject improper quality items.
8. Ribbons and exhibits must be picked up between 2:00 P.M. and 5:00 P.M., Tuesday, October 4.
9. Premiums will be paid on the Danish System of judging.
10. All cut specimens will be discarded at end of fair.
11. To expedite the entry process, exhibitors should have flowers ready to present at check-in. Exhibitors should know into which class each entry should be exhibited.
12. Flowing cannas, daylillies and species that flower for one day only will not be accepted.
13. Potted plants should be in clean containers and watered prior to entry.
