GENERAL ELIGIBILITY RULES

Each individual must:

- 1. Be a member of the Future Farmers of America.
- 2. Three or four members from one chapter constitutes a team and only teams will be eligible for awards, not individuals.
- 3. Carry a minimum of four units of high school work.
- 4. Individuals arriving after contest begins will be declared ineligible.
- 5. Any instructor who fails to do the assigned duties WILL CAUSE HIS OR HER TEAM TO BE DISQUALIFIED. The Superintendent will submit names of those instructors to the General Superintendent. Instructors who will not be able to perform their duties should make prior arrangements with the Superintendent.
- 6. All tabulations turned in by superintendents will be final. Final details will be mailed in August to Agri. Department heads. Any changes will supersede this information and it is the teacher's obligation to be aware of these changes.
