DEADLINE OF REGISTRATION RULE 1 IN GENERAL RULES.

The Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit or animal that may be falsely entered, or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable, without assigning a reason therefore, and, if necessary, to return any money already paid for space or stalls which shall exonerate the show from any claims whatsoever on the part of the exhibitor.

1. Tack may be placed above the pens on a panel or support. There will be no tack in livestock pens.

2. Entries in the Market Goat Whether Goat Show are open to Wether goats only, no does. No bucks allowed.

3. EACH EXHIBITOR MAY ENTER ONLY TWO (2) WETHERS IN THE SHOW.

4. All goats must have a Scrapies Premise ID Tag.

5. All market goats are recommended to be clipped to a maximum of 3/8" with the exception of the lower legs "hocks and knees down" and the end of the tail. No clipping, touch up or shearing of any kind will be allowed on the grounds. Violation will result in disqualification. NO EXCEPTIONS.

6. All market goats should be disbudded or have tipped or rounded. Goats with horns sharper than deemed safe by the Superintendent will be required to be tipped.

- 7. Shavings only for bedding by rule of fire marshal.
- 8. No blocking stands allowed in the barns.
- 9. No scales allowed in barns.
- 10. Mesh muzzles with no wire will be allowed.
- 11. No mats or carpets allowed in pens.

12. All pens must have shaving for bedding. All show boxes, chairs, etc. must be kept out of center aisle. All chairs, tack, etc., must remain behind yellow lines painted on aisle.

- 13. Show open to exhibitors who comply with Rule 40.
- 14. Wethers must be owned by July 15, 2024.

15. Any goat showing signs of fungus or ring worm will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the grounds.

16. Minimum weight is 50 pounds - no maximum.

17. There will be no official weigh-in to determine weight classes for showing. Each exhibitor will weigh their goat and submit that weight on a card to the Superintendent by 7:00 p.m. Sunday, September 22. Show classes will then be determined by that weight. Classes will be posted.

CHECK-IN WILL BE NOON TO 7:00 P.M. SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 22. Cards due by 7:00 p.m. JUDGING WILL BEGIN SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 23 AT 8:00 A.M. JUNIOR MARKET WHETHER GOATS WILL BE RELEASE AT CONCLUSION OF GOAT SHOW.

After judging, the top five animals in each class will again be weighed by the Superintendent on scales that have been placed in the show ring. Any animals over a 5-pound variation from the weight submitted on the weight card will be disqualified.

18. No color alteration will be permitted on Junior Market Goats. This includes all products natural or manmade.

19. Junior exhibitors are subject to adherence to the General Rules and Regulations in the front of this book as well as rules governing the Junior Division.

20. Administration of a drug - See General Rules, Page 4, Paragraph 9.

21. All juniors must show their own animal; all juniors must be present for the premium sale. Exceptions for injury and/or illness must be approved by the superintendent prior to showing.

22. Pen space will be assigned by Junior Goat Superintendent. No scales other than those provided by the fair will be permitted in the barn.

23. Goats are to be unloaded and penned in the barns upon arrival. Goats CANNOT be kept in trailers anytime, day or night. Goats are NOT to be taken to the RV parking areas or parking lots for any reason. If your goats are found to be penned or taken outside of the designated arns or grooming area they will be disqualified.

24. No goat entries will be turned down if they meet the entry deadline.

25. The Grand and Reserve Grand Goats will sell in the premium auction, along with 3rd & 4th overall.

6. All breeding does should have tipped or rounded. Goats with horns sharper than deemed safe by the Superintendent will be required to be tipped.

- 7. Shavings only for bedding by rule of fire marshal.
- 8. No blocking stands allowed in the barns.
- 9. No scales allowed in barns.
- 10. Mesh muzzles with no wire will be allowed.
- 11. No mats or carpets allowed in pens.

12. All pens must have shaving for bedding. All show boxes, chairs, etc. must be kept out of center aisle. All chairs, tack, etc., must remain behind yellow lines painted on aisle.

CHECK-IN WILL BE NOON TO 7:00 P.M. SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 22. Cards due by 2:00 p.m. JUDGING WILL BEGIN SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 22 AT 5:00 P.M. JUNIOR BREEDING DOES WILL BE RELEASE AT CONCLUSION OF THE JUNIOR BREEDING DOE SHOW.

After judging, the top five animals in each class will again be weighed by the Superintendent on scales that have been placed in the show ring. Any animals over a 5-pound variation from the weight submitted on the weight card will be disqualified.
