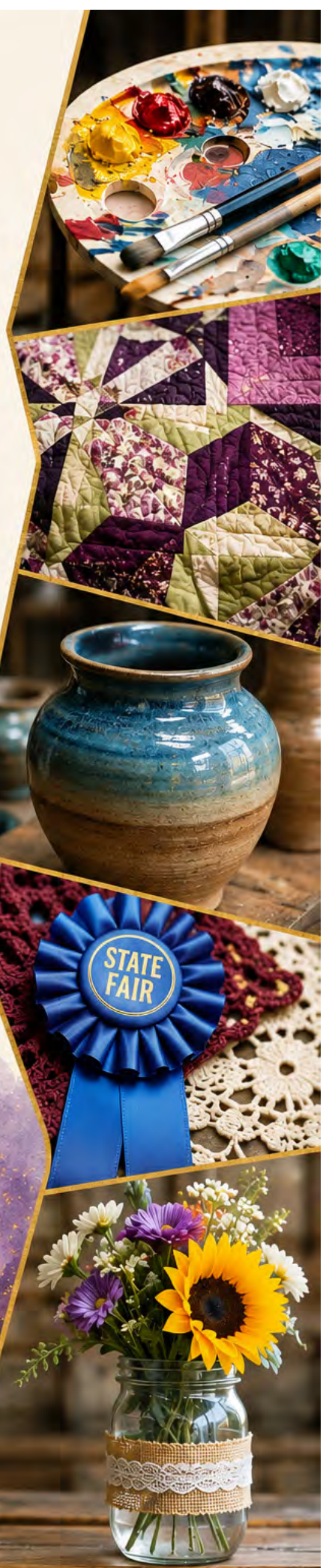

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General Rules

Eligibility

Exhibits must have been completed since September 27, 2025

One entry per class unless otherwise noted.

Entries must be the work of the exhibitor.

No exhibit may be entered in the Arkansas Oklahoma State Fair more than one time.

Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class and exhibits must meet class description.

An entry may be re-classified if it does not fit the class in which the exhibitor entered the item. If the exhibitor has another item in the class, the item will be disqualified. A class will NOT be created to fit the entry.

The management reserves the right to exclude any item from exhibition that is deemed unworthy or inappropriate.

Youth exhibitors in the Creative Arts Division must reside or attend school in the following counties in the states of Arkansas and Oklahoma:

Arkansas: Benton, Conway, Crawford, Franklin, Johnson, Logan, Perry, Polk, Pope, Scott, Sebastian, Yell, and Washington

Oklahoma: Adair, Cherokee, Delaware, Haskell, Latimer, LeFlore, McCurtain, McIntosh, Muskogee, Pittsburg, Sequoyah, and Wagoner

Youth entries are limited to exhibitors who are 5–19 years of age, except as otherwise provided in the Food Preservation Department.

Adult entries are limited to exhibitors who are 20 years of age or older. There is no residency requirement for adult entries in the Creative Arts Division.

Judging

The Danish Point System is used. Premium money will be awarded to Blue and Red exhibits.

Qualified judges evaluate all exhibits and judge's decisions are final.

A Judge's Choice award will receive a rosette and will be displayed in a prominent location.

Exhibit Care

Every effort will be made to protect exhibits. The Fair is not responsible for loss or damage.

How to Enter

Review the Creative Arts Catalog and select the appropriate department/class. Register your entries online August 1, 2026 – August 28, 2026 at 4:00 pm. A confirmation will be emailed to confirm your entries. Please print the confirmation page and bring it to check-in, be sure to list your mailing address.

NO MAIL-IN ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED

Registered entries will be accepted for judging and display at Kay Rodgers Park on
Monday September 21 from 2–6 pm

Volunteers will verify entries, attach exhibit tags, and provide claim tickets. Enjoy the fair and view your exhibits during public display.

Release

All exhibits must be removed by 6 p.m. on October 3, 2026 at which time the building will be closed. The Fair will not be responsible for exhibits not claimed by 6 p.m. They will become the property of the fair and will be disposed of as seen fit by fair officials.

After claiming all entries, please go by the registration desk to claim premium money. If premium checks have not been processed by October 6, they will be mailed to you as soon as office staff can complete processing.

Understanding the Danish Point System

The Creative Arts Division uses the Danish Point System. Exhibits are judged against a standard of excellence rather than against one another. Multiple entries may receive Blue, Red, or White awards based on merit.

Award	Meaning
Blue	Outstanding exhibit meeting the highest standard for the class.
Red	Very good exhibit with only minor deficiencies.
White	Worthy exhibit that meets minimum class requirements.
Judge's Choice	Selected by the judge as an exceptional exhibit within the department.



Preserving Traditions. Sharing Knowledge. Celebrating Excellence.

Home food preservation is a tradition that combines science, safety, and skill. Whether you're entering a jar of tomatoes, homemade jelly, or dried herbs, every exhibit reflects careful preparation and a commitment to quality.

The Food Preservation Department celebrates exhibitors who practice safe, research-based food preservation while preserving family traditions for future generations.

We encourage all exhibitors to follow the most current recommendations from the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning and Cooperative Extension.

Food Preservation Regulations

1. Exhibitors are limited to only one entry in each class. Youth must be at least 12 years old to enter classes in Food Preservation by pressure canner method.
2. Check each section for youth age requirements. Items prepared by youth under age 9 may be entered in the adult division under the name of the adult who assisted the youth with the preservation project. A limit of 1 jar per class per exhibitor will be observed.
3. All products must have been canned by the exhibitor since September 30, 2025.
4. All products must be in standard pint glass jars made for home canning -- except preserves, jams, jellies, dried foods and those preserved by the vinegar and/or sugar method, which may be in standard pint, half-pint, or 12-ounce jars made for home canning.
5. Each jar must be sealed, have a ring band in place, and be cool when brought for exhibit; except for items entered in the Dried Food categories which do NOT have to be sealed.
6. Jars sealed with paraffin will not be accepted.
7. All labels, tags, and other numbers attached to, or written on, jars or jar lids from previous fairs, SHOULD BE REMOVED from jars before entering. The only label that will be allowed is a small label indicating the type of product. (Example: apple jelly or strawberry jam.)

NO NAMES OF EXHIBITORS SHOULD BE ON THE JARS.

Food Preservation

Department Overview

Food Preservation celebrates safe, research-based home food preservation skills while recognizing quality workmanship. Exhibitors should carefully review class descriptions and preparation requirements before entering

Quick Rules

- One entry per class.
- Products must meet current catalog requirements.
- Use standard home canning jars where required.
- Remove previous fair labels before entry.
- Do not place exhibitor names on jars.

HELPFUL TIPS

Clear Jars Matter

Wipe jars thoroughly before bringing them to the fair.

Uniform Pieces

Cut fruits and vegetables into uniform sizes whenever possible.

Proper Headspace

Correct headspace contributes to both food safety and appearance.

Remove Air Bubbles

Removing trapped air before processing improves product appearance.

FINE ARTS

Adult & Youth Divisions

Celebrating imagination, creativity, and artistic excellence.

Department Overview

The Fine Arts Division showcases original artwork created by exhibitors in a variety of media. Whether your work is traditional or contemporary, this department recognizes artistic skill, creativity, craftsmanship, and presentation.

Before You Enter

Only original work created by the exhibitor is eligible.

Artwork should be entered in the appropriate medium and subject category.

Review framing and mounting requirements before check-in.

Artwork should be clean and ready for display.

Rules:

Exhibits must be original work of the exhibitor and not previously shown at the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair.

Subject: No copyrighted cartoon characters allowed. All entries must be appropriate for viewing by all audiences. The decision of the department superintendent is final!

Definitions:

Still Life – an arrangement of inanimate (non-living) , everyday objects, whether natural objects (flowers, food, etc.) or manufactured items (books, bottles, etc.)

Living – must be capable of movement on its own power – a living person or animal.

All artwork must be on canvas, paper or untreated Masonite canvas boards and must be graphic representations using pen, pencil, pastel, paint or charcoal. Painting on metal, glass or wood should be entered in the Crafts department.

Preparation of Artwork:

- A. Only framed entries will be accepted.
- B. Size: Artwork itself, no smaller than 5x7" and no larger than 24x30".
Frames – no smaller than 8x10".
- C. All artwork must be framed according to the following guidelines:

Art should be ready to hang with a standard picture wire hanger consisting of picture wire stretched between eye hooks screwed into the frame. No saw-tooth hangers, soft drink tab hangers, string, twist-tie, or filament hangers will be acceptable for any framed entry. Picture wire, if securely attached to a saw-tooth hanger by the exhibitor, will be accepted.

Please note that all framed entries will be inspected for size and proper attachment of standard picture wire. This is being done to ensure that all framed entries meet catalog requirements. Thank you for your patience and cooperation.

Art – Youth ages 5-19 – SECTION D

Rules:

Exhibits must be original work of the exhibitor and not previously shown at the Arkansas–Oklahoma State Fair. No paint- or color-by-number, or other art kits, will be allowed.

Subject: No copyrighted cartoon characters allowed. All entries must be appropriate for viewing by all audiences. The decision of the department superintendent is final!

Still Life – an arrangement of inanimate (non-living) , everyday objects, whether natural objects (flowers, food, etc.) or manufactured items (books, bottles, etc.)

Living – must be capable of movement on its own power – a living person or animal.

All entries must be on canvas, paper or untreated Masonite canvas-boards and must be graphic representations using pen, pencil, pastel, paint or charcoal. Painting on glass, metal or wood should be entered in the Crafts department.

Preparation of artwork:

Youth art display fixtures prohibit the use of frames; therefore, only matted or mounted art will be accepted in the youth division — no frames or glass.

Art work may be over-wrapped in clear plastic if desired.

Youth with framed entries may enter their work in the Adult Art Department and must abide by all size and preparation rules for that department.

Size: Artwork done on paper should be no smaller than 5x7” and no larger than 12x18”.

Stretched canvas or canvas-board entries should be unframed and must meet the minimum and maximum sizes in part D below.

Items not painted on stretched canvas or canvas-board must be mounted or matted with a stiff backing. No entries will be accepted matted with, or mounted on, poster board, card stock or construction paper – these items are not heavy enough to stay on the display stand, and they tend to curl up. Hangers are not required.

Minimum total size of entry including mat or mount is 8x10”;maximum size including mat or mount is 18x24”.

Photography

The Photography Division recognizes technical skill, creativity, composition, lighting, and storytelling. Photographs should reflect the exhibitor's own work.

Preparation Checklist

1. Do not frame photographs.
2. Use sturdy mat board or mounting.
3. No lettering on the front of the exhibit.
4. Review size requirements before entering.

Rules:

Photos for exhibit must have been taken by the exhibitor and not previously shown at the Arkansas-Oklahoma State Fair.

Subjects: All entries must be appropriate for viewing by all audiences.

Class definitions:

- Still Life – an arrangement of inanimate (non-living) , everyday objects, whether natural objects (flowers, food, etc.) or manufactured items (books, bottles, etc.)
- Action – subject should be in action-type activity – sports, horse racing, car racing, etc.
- Portrait – Photos of people

Preparation of Photographs:

Photography display fixtures prohibit the use of frames; **therefore, only matted or mounted photography will be accepted** – no frames or glass. Matted photos may be over-wrapped in clear plastic if desired. Hangers are NOT required.

A. Size: Photograph should be no smaller than 4"x6" and no larger than 16"x 20".

B. Matting or mounting specifications:

- Use standard mat board, or other stiff materials that are at least the weight of mat-board. **NO POSTER BOARD, CONSTRUCTION PAPER OR LIGHTER WEIGHT PAPER MATS OR MOUNTS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
- Minimum total size of entry including mat or mount is 8 X 10".
- Maximum total size of entry including mat or mount is 20 X 24".

C. No lettering is permitted on the front of mount or on the photo.

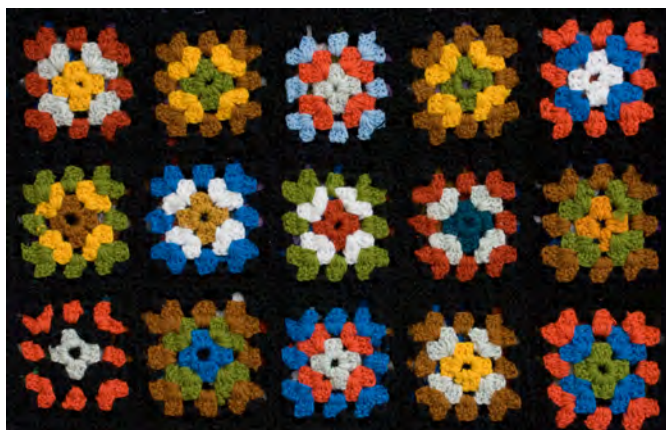

Highlighting handmade creations that celebrate imagination, innovation, and artistic expression.

- **Framed entries must be ready to hang with a standard picture wire hanger.**
- No saw-tooth hangers, soft drink tab hangers, string, twist-tie, or filament hangers will be accepted. Picture wire securely attached to a saw-tooth hanger by the exhibitor will be accepted.
- Items meant to be displayed by hanging **MUST** have a device by which to hang the item. Rules for framed entries apply.
- Items may have stitching, but should not be duplicates of other classes listed in another section of this catalog.
- **Duplicate entries are not permitted across crafts classes.**
- **Portraits, pictures, mixed media and other graphic artwork will not be accepted into this category.**
- Holiday items must include some symbol typically associated with the holiday; for example:
 - Christmas: Santa, bell, snowman, angel, tree, candy cane, etc.
 - Halloween: Jack-o-lantern, witch, ghost, skeleton, bat, spider, etc.
 - Thanksgiving: Pumpkin, turkey, Pilgrim, corn, haystack, etc.
 - Easter: Rabbit, chick, egg, cross, lily, etc.
- **No needlework allowed.**
